MEMORY VERSE: James 5:16 – Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT: Luke 13:26 - "Then you will begin to say, 'We ate and drank in your presence, and you taught in our streets." Proximity to Jesus and the things of faith is not faith itself. Many Pharisees heard His Word but ignored it and refused to believe in it. We want to be not only hearers, but also doers of Jesus' Word. We want not only proximity to Jesus, but true communion with Him. We want to hear Him, follow Him, praise Him and return thanks.

LIFE THOUGHT – Proverbs 3:8 promises that fearing the Lord and turning from evil brings healing to "your navel." Belly buttons testify to gestation. Scripture's prescription for surprise pregnancy encourages rejecting death.
