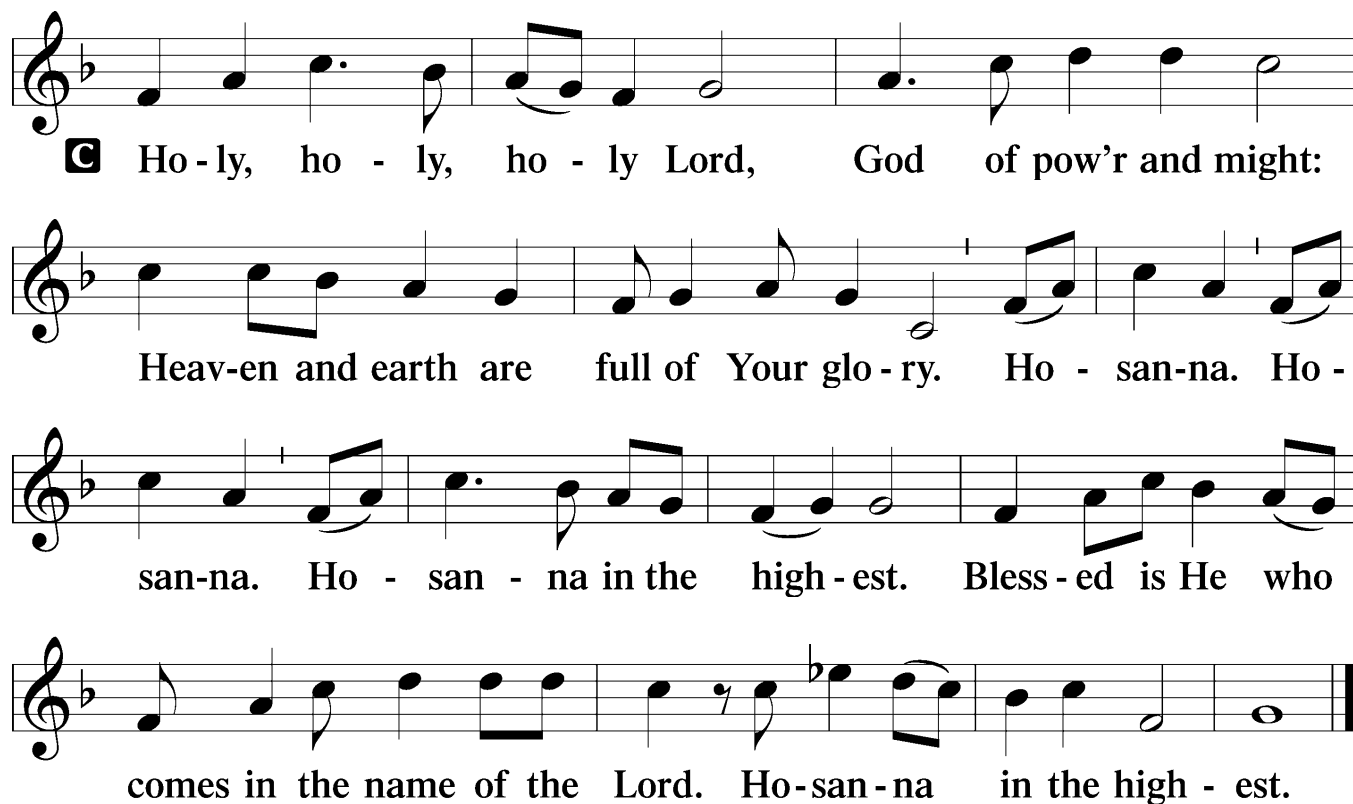


Proper Preface
